Complaints Procedure for the Oxford University Conservative Association

This document serves as a summary of Part 5 of the Association's Rules and Standing Orders.

- 1. Grounds for Complaints
- 1.1. A complaint may be made in regard to any of the following:
 - (a) Behaviour or actions which may serve to bring the Association into disrepute.
 - (b) Substantial failure by an officeholder to fulfil their duties.
 - (c) Breach of the Association's Code of Conduct or any University policy.
 - (d) Behaviour which is abusive towards an officeholder while they are carrying out their duties.
 - (e) Any form of electoral malpractice as defined under Rule 5(1)(b)(i).
- 2. Seeking advice or support
- 2.1. The Welfare Officer is able to discuss concerns and to offer support in strict confidence.
- 2.2. The President and the Returning Officer shall also be available in this capacity.
- 3. Referral of Complaints
- 3.1. Complaints should be submitted in writing to the Returning Officer, or, if the complaint is being made against the Returning Officer, to the President.
- 3.2. If the Returning Officer believes the complaint to be sufficiently serious they shall convene a meeting of the Disciplinary Committee within one week.
- 4. Sanctions
- 4.1. The Disciplinary Committee may decide to impose up to two of the following sanctions:
 - (a) A motion of censure in the Member's conduct.
 - (b) The removal of Activist Points from the Member.
 - (c) The removal of the Member from the Member's office.
 - (d) A ruling that the Member may not stand for any elected position.
 - (e) A fine of no more than four times the nomination fee for the office of President-elect.
 - (f) Suspension from the Association for not longer than sixteen weeks of Full Term.
 - (g) Expulsion from the Association.
- 5. Interim measures
- 5.1. Where a complaint is made against a Member and the Returning Officer considers such a course to be necessary, the Returning Officer may, with the consent of the President, temporarily ban the Member from attending all Association events and from enjoying the rights of Membership.
- 6. Appeal
- 6.1. Appeal of the decision of the Disciplinary Committee may be made to the Senior Member, whose decision shall be final.
